In order for analytics to be accurately tracked a unique identifier must be present, in The Training Arcade® this is either <Email> or <ID>

- First name or initials are required when a leaderboard is in use (Char Max 30)
- All other fields can be “Optional” “Required” or “Disabled” based on the data you would like to collect from the players - with the exception of Email and ID (See above)
- Note, any fields listed here are for your data use only, and recommend not showing PII on the game leaderboards for user's privacy.

2 additional fields can be added, including custom fields.

To add a Custom Field:


Click “add new custom field”

Select <Existing> to use an already built custom field.


Custom fields can be shared across games and used concurrently.

Removing a custom field from a game will remove the data from the analytics.





Adding A New Custom Field

Enter “Type”

- Dropdown allows player to pick a preselected field
- Text Entry allows a player to enter their own data





When Using Custom Fields = Header Body = If a game has been set to have registration with custom fields, there will be a new dropdown visible on the leaderboard page by which you can sort these custom fields. 

To hide single line or specific entries from an ungrouped leaderboard; click the “red eye” icon next to each line


